

Dear Members and Friends of New Bedford Church,

As we move from our busy Easter season we encounter a very busy May. There are three major church celebrations in May.

On May 10th we celebrate Mother's Day. It gives us the opportunity to praise God (as well as the women in our lives) for the blessings we have received. *Proverbs 31* gives us a description of a "wife of noble character." Here is the description....

**A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies.
Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of value.
She selects wool and flax and works with eager hands. She gets up while it is still dark; she provides food for her family
She considers a field and buys it; out of her earnings she plants a vineyard. She opens her arms to the poor and extends her hands to the needy. When it snows, she has no fear for her household; for all of them are clothed in scarlet.
She makes coverings for her bed; she is clothed in fine linen and purple.
She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come.
She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue.
She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness.
Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her:**

Notice the amazing description of a "woman of noble character." She is a woman of God both in the home and in the work place. She is a business woman and a woman who manages her home. The final sentence is critically important.... children and husbands are to praise our mothers and wives and thank God for the blessing we have.

Two weeks after Mother's Day is our celebration of Memorial Day. Once again in our worship we will honor our servicemen and women past and present. Lead by our choir we will pray for our nation, pray for our armed forces and thank the Lord for the heritage of our nation. We praise God that we are "one nation under God." This is indeed one of the highlights of the year in our church family.

The final Sunday of the month is Pentecost Sunday. This is the day we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending upon the believers after the ascension of our Lord. It is considered the third great celebration of the church. As I stress during our celebrations of Easter and Christmas, we are not just celebrating a past event. The Pentecost we will also celebrate a present reality. The Holy Spirit is present in our midst today. Where is the Holy Spirit? He is in the lives of those who have surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ. This wonderful promise is found in *John 14*

If you love me, you will obey what I command. 16And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever— 17the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you.

Indeed, May is a time of celebration and joy. Together we will continue to worship the Lord. Together we will share the joy of the blessing the Lord has given to each of us!
